LITE's COVID-19 Response

Distributed \$10K in Emergency Wages, allowing very low-income people to join community-based efforts to serve their community.

Partnered with The Cutting Edge and Pollock's Hardware Cooperative to sell non-medical cloth masks on our online store, shop.lite.mb.ca. This effort supported 5 jobs for newcomer women. And, thanks to social purchasers, we delivered 400 free masks to community organizations!

Distributed a poster on how to safely use and care for non-medical cloth masks, designed with thanks to Manoverboard.
